Maths

We have daily maths sessions and these will include number songs, oral and practical counting, sorting and classifying of objects, recognition and ordering of numbers to 10 and beyond, solving problems using practical objects and introducing the concepts of length, shape, size and pattern.

Helping at home

The children will bring home pink phonics books for you to practise the sounds daily. We will learn 3 new sounds each week.

On Tuesdays the children will visit the library and will bring home a book for you to share together (to be returned the following Tuesday.)

Please practise pulling out sleeves from coats, cardigans and jumpers when taking them off, to enable them to be put on again independently!

Topic

Topics covered will reflect the children's interests but will also include teddy bears, harvest/vegetables, Autumn, Diwali, Christmas and stories such as "The little red hen" and "Goldilocks and the three bears".

Phonics

We will have daily phonics sessions and introduce our Jolly Phonics scheme.

PE Days

PE will be on Monday and Friday. The children need PE kit for indoors and outdoors.
